Monday—April 25

NDP Block Support for Seniors

The NDP voted with the Liberals against a Bloc amendment to the Budget that called for:



- more spending on healthcare
- direct support for seniors
- offer solutions to the rising cost of living for individuals and their businesses; and
- consult and respect the jurisdictions of Quebec, the provinces and territories.

Only Conservatives and the Bloc voted in favour.

Tuesday—April 26

NDP Support Higher Spending/Taxes

NDP caucus voted against a Conservative amendment to the Budget that called for less spending, lower taxes and increasing housing supply.

And of the amendment of Mr. Fast (Abbotsford), seconded by Mr. Chambers (Simcoe North), — That the motion be amended by deleting all the words after the word “That” and substituting the following:

“the House not approve the budgetary policy of the government since it fails to:

(a) rein in spending in order to control inflation;

(b) provide Canadians with tax relief; and

(c) take immediate action to increase housing supply.”.

Wednesday—April 27

NDP Cover-up Lab Scandal

The NDP agreed to support the Liberals to prevent Parliament from getting answers on the national security breach at the Winnipeg Microbiology Lab. Last year the NDP actually stood up to the Liberals and demanded the documents.

They are now complicit in the cover-up.



Thursday—April 28

NDP Cover-up WE Scandal

The NDP fully sold out on Thursday:

First, NDP voted for a procedural motion to prevent the Ethics committee from (finally!) getting to the bottom of the WE Charity Scandal.



Then, the NDP supported the Liberals’ motion 11 that empowers any Trudeau Cabinet Minister to move a motion at any time to adjourn the House until September.

This provision essentially allows the Government to pull the ejection latch when they can no longer control the narrative on all their scandals.

Friday—April 29

NDP Support Higher Taxes on Farm Fuel

The NDP refused to put up any speakers to oppose Bill C-8 during debate. Bill C-8 fails to provide the targeted tax relief that families deserve and fails to provide adequate support to farmers and agricultural producers who have struggled with punitive costs on their operations as a result of the Liberals’ carbon tax on farm fuel.
